

### A COMMUNITY DREAM COMES TRUE

In just six weeks, on Memorial Day to be exact, a long-time dream turns into reality when one of the most unusual community swimming clubs in the Nation will be completed and opened to the residents of McLean and surrounding areas.

Located on 9 1/2 acres of rolling hillside in a heavily wooded glen in Potomac Hills, the Highlands Swim Club will have two round swimming pools, a "tiny-tots" pool, deluxe bath house, and spacious patio, picnic, and parking facilities. The swimming pools (equivalent in total surface area to three standard 50 X 82.5 pools) will accommodate virtually every kind of water activity, with three regulation diving boards, twelve Olympic-size racing lanes, two gigantic sliding boards, and ample deep water and shallow water areas. The bath house will feature individual tile showers, the most modern interior lighting, and mirrored dressing vanities for the ladies.

Completion of the Club represents the culmination of almost 3 years of effort by a group of civic-minded citizens intent on improving recreational facilities in the community. Through the splendid cooperation of Fairfax County officials and round-theclock efforts of a Board of Directors of local residents, the Club was able to buy the land from the County and obtain a use permit. The Club is strictly a community, non-profit effort and has no connection with any other private or public Club.

The need for a local neighborhood Swimming Club was amply proven in two previous membership solicitations. In the first of these, held long before the land was purchased, 200 members signed up over a single week-end. With such strong encouragement, plans were rushed to buy the land and begin

engineering studies. A second membership invitation brought in another 100 members. Since then, new members have been steadily added.

The final general invitation is being offered on the week-end of April 23-24 for the remaining memberships. After these have been applied for, future prospective members will be required to place their names on a waiting list. In the McLean area, these waiting lists are becoming longer every Summer.

The facilities are in the final stages of construction and the target date for the grand opening is Memorial Day. The membership fee remains, for the time being, at \$500.00 and is refundable on request, under conditions set forth in the by-laws of the Club. All membership applications are subject to approval of the Board of Directors. In the event of over-subscription, date and hour of application will determine the order of priority.

#### MORT -McLEAN BUSINESSMAN



Mort Kaplan, owner of Mort's Bootery, traveled a long and devious route to McLean from his birthplace in Baltimore's Sinai Hospital, but he is here to stay. One of six children, Mort began selling shoes at the age of 16

while he was still in high school. His early training was given to him by his brother who was operating a shoe store in Washington. After high school, Mort began selling shoes in a Baltimore women's specialty shop, but not for long. World War II began, and Mort enlisted in the infantry. For the next four years, Private (eventually T/Sgt.) Kaplan served overseas in five major campaigns, emerging from the Army wearing the Bronze Star.

In 1948, Mort opened his first store in Buckingham, which, at that time, was way out in the country. Ten successful years later, he closed the store and opened his present Fairfax store at 10350 Lee Highway in the Fairfax Shopping Center. Mort moved to a new frontier in 1959 when he came to McLean in the new Salona Shopping Center. There he has been for the past seven years and there he intends to stay, offering his customers an extensive line of nationally advertised brands of footwear.

Forensics is one aspect of school sponsored activity that is is often forgotten in the scramble involved in sports, dramatics, and school politics.

The forensic program consists of seven categories: Girls' Prose Reading, Boys' Prose Reading, Girls' Poetry Reading, Boys' Poetry Reading, Girls' Public Speaking, Boys' Public Speaking, and Spelling. Each high school selects a winner in each field from among the class winners. The school winners represent the school at the district meet.

In previous years, all schools from Fairfax and Arlington Counties met in one competition, with one winner in each area selected to represent Northern Virginia. This year,

however, district forensic competition was divided into three districts, similar to those used in sports competition.

The Potomac District Meet, held April 2 at Marshall, involved winners from McLean, Langley, Marshall, Stuart, W-L, Wakefield, and Yorktown high schools. Three of the seven district champions were from Wakefield High School; the other four from Langley and McLean. Libby Cain of McLean won Spelling, John Berrini, from Langley, won Boys' Public Speaking, Jodie Johnson, from Langley, won Girls' Public Speaking, and Mike Murphy, also from Langley, won Boys' Poetry Reading.

These finalists will attend the State Forensic Meet in Charlottesville, April 23.






## Behind The Scenes In McLean


